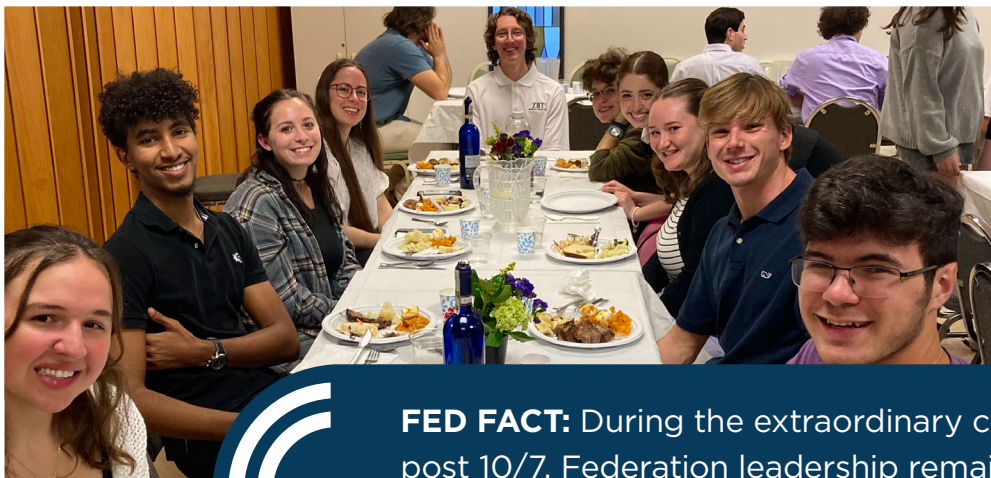

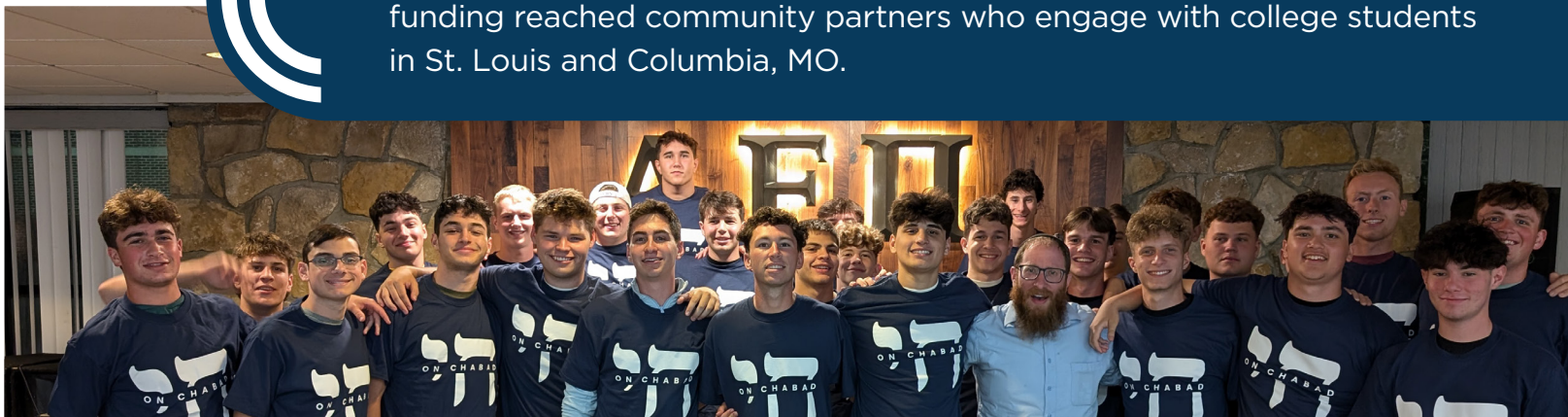

FED FACT: The primary role of the new Security Coordinator is to ensure that all security platforms and programs are functioning efficiently. Examples include the Rave Mass Notification System, the Open Gate weapons detection system and the Police Pool scheduling system.

Security needs continued to grow in 2024. Three additional community partners joined Federation's Community Security Program and the Jewish Federation of St. Louis expanded staffing with the hiring of additional security guards and a new, full-time, Security Coordinator.

IMPACT STORY:

Highlights of our emergency support post-October 7 include:

- Unique therapies including 3-day healing workshops for survivors of the Nova Music Festival
- Lifeline services and support including protective shelters
- Trauma relief and mental health support
- Emergency communication devices amidst rising antisemitic threats
- Personalized emergency kits and lifesaving items for elderly at risk, Holocaust survivors and families with members with disabilities



FED FACT: St. Louis was one of the first communities to participate in the Jewish Agency for Israel's Communities2Gether initiative. In 2024, our partnership areas expanded to take in and support the evacuated families of Kibbutz Nahal Oz who were one of the communities attacked on October 7, 2023.

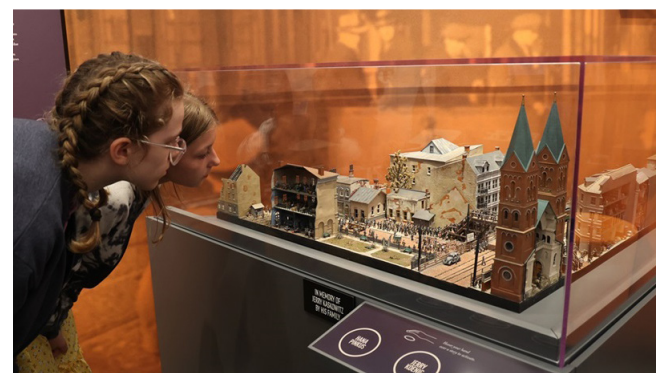

- ✦ Recruitment support for full-time, part-time and substitute teachers
- ✦ Credentialing through American Jewish University
- ✦ Year of Learning coursework from the Jewish New Teacher Project
- ✦ Experimentation grants and stipends
- ✦ Assessment through Rosov Consulting

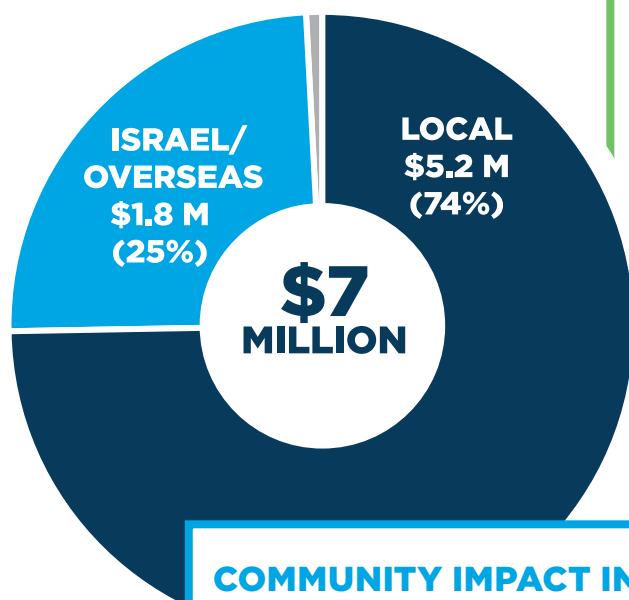

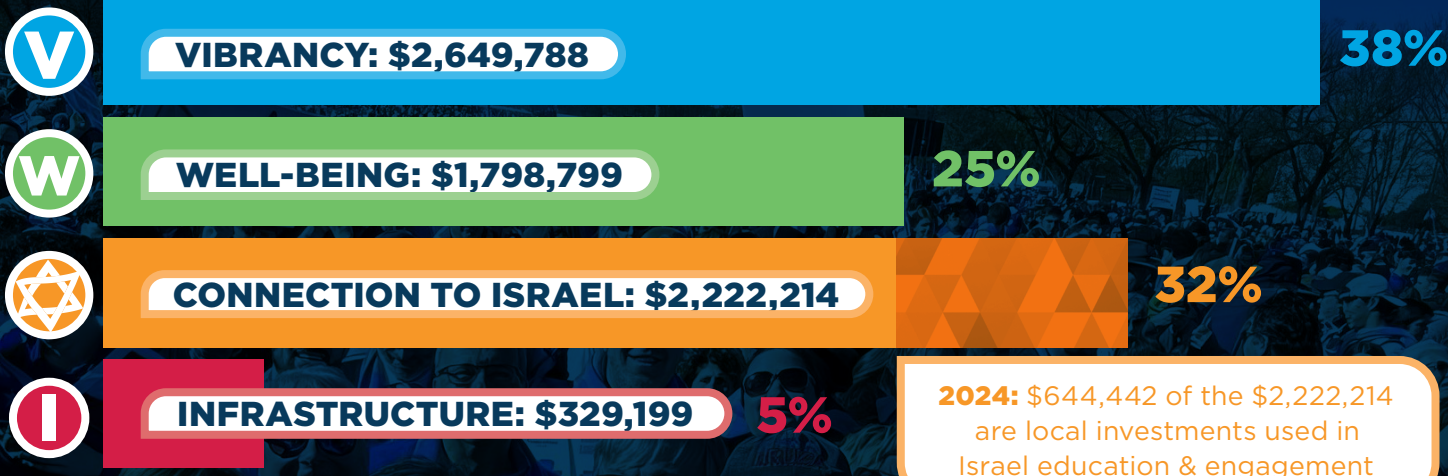
